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ABOUT PROJECT

Work Safety from the Youth's Perspective

According to the International Labor Organization (ILO); Every year, 350 thousand people lose their lives due to work accidents and 2 million people lose their lives due to occupational diseases (The results show that an average of 6.5 thousand people dies every day due to work accident / occupational diseases). Each year, 160 million people get occupational diseases. Even if it is not even comparable to the costs to human health, work accidents and occupational diseases also have high costs for the economies of the countries. 4% of the World's GDP (US \$ 1,251,353 million) is spent on occupational accidents and occupational diseases. According to the European Statistical Office (Eurostat) and SGK data; unfortunately, Turkey stands as one of the top-ranking countries regarding the number of deaths caused by occupational accidents. According to the report of the Occupational Health and Safety Assembly, at least 2 thousand workers died in our country in 2017 due to work accidents. In the EU, the Netherlands is the country with the lowest number of workers' deaths according to the total number of people employed. The death rate per 100 thousand employees in this country is 0.50. Romania has the highest rate with 5.56, followed by Lithuania with 3.84 and Bulgaria with 3.57. In 2015, as KIO, we realized the project that brought together young people and decision-makers in parallel with the basic principles of structured dialogue called " 21st Century Occupational Accidents - What are Young People Thinking? " (www.kio.org.tr). Our project, which is within the EU 2020 Goals - improving the workplace conditions of the workplace - and the priority of E + to support

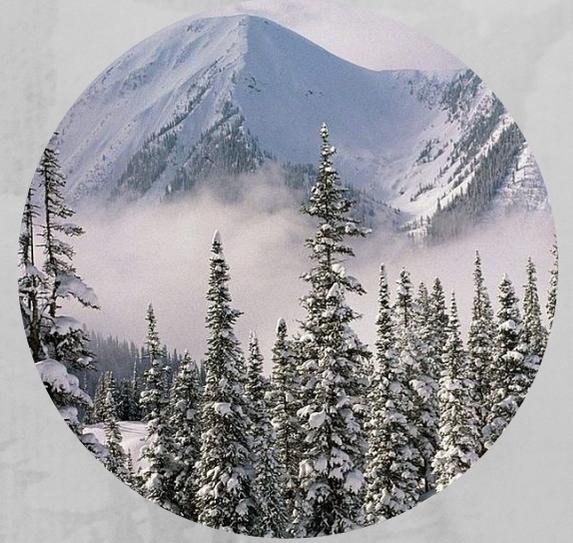

Bursa is a city in northwestern Turkey and the administrative center of Bursa Province. The fourth-most populous city in Turkey and second-most populous in the Marmara Region, Bursa is one of the industrial centers of the country. Most of Turkey's automotive production takes place in Bursa. Bursa (Ottoman Turkish) was the first major and second overall capital of the Ottoman State between 1335 and 1363. The city was referred to as Hüdavendigâr (meaning "God's gift" in Ottoman Turkish, a name of Persian origin) during the Ottoman period, while a more recent nickname is "Green Bursa" in reference to the parks and gardens located across its urban fabric, as well as to the vast and richly varied forests of the surrounding region. Mount Uludağ, the ancient Mysian Olympus, towers over it, and has a well-known ski resort. Bursa has rather orderly urban growth and borders a fertile plain. The mausoleums of the early Ottoman sultans are located in Bursa, and the city's main landmarks include numerous edifices built throughout the Ottoman period. Bursa also has thermal baths, old Ottoman mansions, palaces, and several museums.

Regional cuisine of Bursa is very rich and varied, it has remained under the shadow of "İskender Kebab" the most popular dish of Bursa. Throughout the history, most of the famous travellers have visited Bursa and wrote in their journals about the diverse dishes with high regards.

"Uzun Çarşı is very colorful and fancy with all the shopkeepers available to take care of your needs. The "Kebabçılar" marketplace located in Pirinç Han is very elaborate. Fruit compote is unique to this realm. The white bread tastes as good as the white bread from the Tophane bakery in İstanbul. The "çakıl" bread is only found in this realm. The white pastry is like a rose. They have wonderful kebabs due to the fleshy animals they breed. Helva with musk is wonderful as well. The lifewater that you will drink from Pınarbaşı, where water flows from 17 different places, various fruit compotes, colorful sherbets, coffees, strained bozas (the fermented millet drink). There are 40 different varieties of pears. Various grapes, apricots, cherries, and chestnuts are matchless. There are 7 different types of mulberries."

COSTS

Accommodation, travel, food will be covered within the program. Most importantly, travel costs will be reimbursed approximately after 3 months of the submission of all the original travel documents. Reimbursements will be done through bank transfer so as to assure the travel documents like boarding passes, bus and train tickets.

Personal spending money

As a general rule, any cash machine that displays the Visa badge can be used by Plus cardholders and those displaying the MasterCard badge can be used by Cirrus cardholders. Recognised international credit cards and debit cards with a 4 digit PIN can also be used at shops.

Health/medical insurance/Visa

Please make sure you have adequate personal insurance (medical, travel/cancellation, personal possessions) for the duration of the event. There is no budget for insurance&Visa, so you should pay for your own.

Smoking/non-smoking arrangements

Turkey introduced a law to make all closed public places and workplaces not allowed to smoke.

The shops

The opening time for shops is around 8 am then the closing time is at 10 pm.

Electrical voltage

Turkey standard voltage is 220 V 50 hz, with 2 round pins plugs. You may wish to bring an adapter with you.

Form for Entry to Turkey

The form must be filled in within the last 72 hours before travel.

Information on the website should be filled in order to provide you proper information and protect the health of yours and loved ones during the Covid-19 pandemic. A private HES code will be created automatically by the given information. We will be able to contact with you in the case of any contact with Covid-19 patient during your travel and staying thanks to HES Code. For this reason, the accuracy and update ability of the information is quite important.

The form you will fill may be checked at the borders of the Republic of Turkey whether you have filled in this form or not, and If you haven't filled in the form or made misleading statements, you may face legal and administrative sanctions. Furthermore, you might not be allowed to enter Turkey. (if you are not a Turkish Citizen or you do not have a residence permit).
